Incident Number	Date	Incident Narrative		
1	4/2022	(H) Employee was putting a 6 in main line and he felt something tweek in his back.		
2	4/2022	(I) Several employees were handling a bundle of 8in pipe, one of them brought the bundle down too quickly and caused injury to employees finger.		
3	4/2022	(I) Crew was shutting down the project when 40 mph gusts arose and caused a piece of plywood to strike a worker in the face. Worker suffered a facial laceration and a fracture to his maxillary sinus.		
4	4/2022	(I) While performing the morning Stretch and Flex, the worker heard a pop in his left knee. The worker felt OK and returned to work. The worker felt swelling and pain overnight and was seen at an Occupational Clinic the following morning and was determined to have a left knee strain. The worker was released back to work the same day by the clinic with restrictions provided		
5	4/2022	(I) A team member was standing on the steps of his dump truck and lost his balance falling to the ground, the team member suffered a sprained back.		
6	4/2022	(J) Employee stumbled, fell against machine, dislocating right shoulder.		
7	4/2022	(J) A team member removed his glove and placed his hand in the line of fire of a pressure washer and suffered a laceration.		
8	4/2022	(J) Employee was climbing pole and had electrical contact. First aid treatment at hospital.		
9	4/2022	(J) Employee picked up a pipe from the ground and tweaked his back.		
10	4/2022	(J) Employee was prying a compressor to move it off a stand, and the pry bar slipped. He smashed his finger up against the railing.		
11	4/2022	(J) When employee was walking out for his break , he slipped & hit his right knee on a concrete wall.		
12	4/2022	(J) Employee was pulling a pipe and felt a pop in his left elbow.		
13	4/2022	(J) Employee was climbing up a rack system & his right arm got caught on a point on the rack & accidentally cut his arm.		
14	4/2022	(J) An employee was welding in deck drains under the Base Inlet cluster. Deck was wet before welding began. Water soaked through the employee's pants and coveralls. He began to feel some skin irritation and discomfort on the side of his thigh.		
15	4/2022	(J) Employee was walking and trip and fell and tooth got chipped.
