

### **EXCELLENCE IN SAFETY AWARD**

The **CCS** Excellence in Safety Award is designed to recognize companies that demonstrate an outstanding commitment to safety performance through robust written safety programs. It is the highest honor that CCS can bestow on a company.

The submission process will require a 15-minute presentation in front of the panel of volunteer judges. The presentation can be made in person or through web conferencing. The judges will decide on the top 8-10 submissions. Gary Martin, CCS Safety Director, will then perform a site visit for these top companies. CCS will provide a week time span these site visits will take place and the top companies will provide CCS with three job sites. Gary will then show up unannounced on one of these sites during the provided week.

Based on the presentations and site visit data the judges' panel will unanimously select the top five who will be recognized as Safety Leaders with the most outstanding being presented the coveted "Crystal Eagle" Excellence in Safety Award.

Winners will be announced at the Annual CCS Awards Celebration on *April 27, 2023* at the Scottish Rite Cathedral in Indianapolis.

Qualifying companies <u>must be</u> involved on a construction team.

#### **Presentation**

- NEW FOR 2023
  - The company owner, CEO, COO, President, or VP is required to be present during your presentation.
  - Judges will determine their top 8-10 presentations.
     Site visits for the top 8-10 will be conducted in late March.
- The entrant must answer key questions to demonstrate how the company is addressing safety performance.

# Eligibility and Submission Requirements

- Company must be a CCS Association Member.
- Company must be a General/Prime Contractor, Construction Manager, Subcontractor or Developer.
- Submission must be one PDF document and include:
  - o award application
  - safety statistics form (if not in the CCS Certification Program)
- Company must be available to make a 15-minute presentation (in person or via web conferencing)
- Any departure from the guidelines will be considered incomplete and may result in the judges deeming the entry invalid.
- Entries must be emailed to awards@mattisoncorp.com.
- Submissions must be received no later than Friday, February 3, 2023 at 5 p.m. EST.
- CCS staff will reach out in February to schedule the presentation.



- The purpose of the presentation is to give your organization the ability to explain to the judges how your company distinguishes itself with regards to safety programs and why your company should be considered for the industry's highest safety award.
- The total length of the presentation must not exceed fifteen (15) minutes.
- Presentations will be scheduled for March 6-7, 2023

### **PRESENTATION**

### CCS EXCELLENCE IN SAFETY AWARD

To be considered for the CCS Excellence in Safety Award, you will be required to make a presentation in front of the judges' panel. The presentation may be done in person or via web conferencing and may include up to three presenters. The dates for the presentations are March 6-7, 2023 at the CCS Office in Indianapolis.

Below are topics that should be addressed, in order, as part of your presentation. Your presentation may include other subject matter, but the total length of the presentation **cannot exceed fifteen (15) minutes.** Entrants may be subject to questions from the judges following the presentation.

- 1. What indicators do you use to evaluate your safety performance and how is the data collected used to improve safety on-site?
- 2. How does your company foster safety buy in throughout your organization?
- 3. Describe your administrative procedures to ensure safety in job planning and your approach for communicating these plans to the tradespeople working on-site.
- 4. Describe how your company recognizes hazards, ensures compliance and corrects unsafe conditions in a timely manner.
- 5. When an event occurs, describe the communication process for corrective action. What systems are utilized to ensure that the message has been received throughout your organization?
- 6. Describe your company's efforts to continually improve safety through implementation of new initiatives.
- 7. What are you doing as a company to advance workplace safety not only in your own organization but also with your delivery partners?
- 8. Describe your company's executive effort to drive safety culture. Give examples.
