<b>Incident Number</b>	<b>Date</b>	<b>Incident Narrative</b>
<b>1</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(H) Employee was climbing over a 2x4 and rebar to enter the work area, then stumbled and rolled their ankle, resulting in a fractured ankle.
<b>2</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(H) Employee was in an aerial lift pulling cable and felt discomfort in his back, causing a strain.
<b>3</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(H) Employee was up in bucket to put fiber rope into position. He landed the first rope, came down and picked up the top rope from the bottom arm. As he was in the process of landing the rope in the top block, the jib swung and pushed him into the top arm resulting in a head fracture injury.
<b>4</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(H) While unloading a heavy piece of equipment from a vehicle, a segment of the equipment shifted and fell, impacting the employee. His ankle was caught beneath the equipment as it struck the vehicle's tailgate, resulting in a fall, fracturing his pelvis.
<b>5</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(I) Employee was performing his task on an ice-covered roof, fell, and received bruised ribs.
<b>6</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(I) Employee received injury to left pinky finger, when 3/4" rigid conduit fell.
<b>7</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(I) Team of Ironworkers tried to move a conveyor by hand, pushing the equipment. One of the Ironworkers felt pain in lower abdomen.
<b>8</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(I) Millwright felt a pop in his bicep while pushing a piece of equipment by hand.
<b>9</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee had finger smashed in between 2 pieces of metal, resulting in 8 stitches.
<b>10</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee's hand became caught between pipe and cribbing while unloading truck, resulting in a fractured right pinky finger.
<b>11</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee was overhead drilling and received debris in their eye.
<b>12</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) A jobsite trailer flipped over due to high winds, causing pain and soreness in employee.
<b>13</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee was using a razor knife to cut material and cut their hand.
<b>14</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee was cutting plywood, and the wind blew sawdust under their glasses into their eye, causing eye irritation.
<b>15</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Material slipped in employee's hand and a sharp edge cut their hand.
<b>16</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) A Field Tech was unloading the back of pick-up truck. Their hand slipped and impacted the metal support of the truck bed, causing a laceration to their lower thumb.
<b>17</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) While standing, the employee hit their head into the bottom corner of the defibrillator box, resulting in a scalp laceration.
<b>18</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee was climbing out of concrete cable trench using a ladder. As he was stepping off the ladder, he stepped on a rock and rolled his right ankle causing pain.
<b>19</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee went to tip up a small rack off the ground by hand. As he bent down, he grabbed one side of the rack and began lifting; he felt a sharp pain in his lower left back, causing a strain.
<b>20</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee, while wearing proper gloves, was in the process of setting up the concrete top form. As he was maneuvering the rails through the anchor bolts, the rail slipped from his hand and contacted his left thumb causing pain.
<b>21</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee grabbed an X-brace that was being maneuvered by a crane as it was hung up on a stump when his left hand was pinched between the X-braces causing pain.
<b>22</b>	<b>3/2025</b>	(J) Employee picked up 8' cross arm to move to the work location. While moving the cross arm, it slipped and landed on his left foot causing pain in toe.

23	3/2025	(J) Employee was exiting bucket and walking across the catwalk when the metal studs on his Neos lost traction on the metal surface. The employee lost his footing, fell backward onto the ground, and landed on his right wrist causing pain.
24	3/2025	(J) Employee sprained their left hand catching material.
25	3/2025	(J) Employee pinched their finger when adjusting forks on a forklift.
26	3/2025	(J) Employee was drilling overhead and got debris in their eye.
