

OUTSTANDING PROJECT SAFETY AWARD

The CCS **Outstanding Project Safety Award** is given to projects that exemplify an outstanding commitment to safety. The Outstanding Project Safety Award is presented to the Owner-Contractor team for the project.

CCS will award up to three Outstanding Project Safety Awards based on size and scope. All type of projects will be considered. Due to varying types of projects, there are no defined categories. The decision will be left to the panel of judges to evaluate the submissions and determine which projects deserve recognition.

Winners will be announced at the Annual CCS Awards Celebration on April 23, 2026 at the Scottish Rite Cathedral.

Project Narrative

Please include information regarding the following items in your project narrative. The project narrative must not exceed ten (10) pages.

- Description of project.
- Breakdown of any incidents or injuries (please include specific details of each incident including type of injury, what happened and why).
- Description of programs, initiatives, policies and other evidence that demonstrate an outstanding commitment to safety on the project.
- Description of working conditions or other unique circumstances such as hazard exposures, complexity of project or multiple contractors and how they were addressed with regard to safety.
- Description of the relationship between the owner and contractor and how it impacted safety performance on the project.

Photos/Logos

- As part of the submission, please include high resolution photos (.jpg, .tif or .psd files) of the following:
 - o Photos of the project during and after construction. A maximum of five (5) should be submitted.
- As part of the submission, please include color logos of both the owner company and the contractor company in .jpg or .tif format.

Eligibility and Submission Requirements

- A project can be nominated by a contractor, individual, owner or design professional.
- Only one nomination per project is allowed.
- The project owner or contractor must be a current CCS Association Member.
- The project must have been completed between March 1, 2025 and February 28, 2026.
- Submission must include: award application
 - list of contractors
 - project narrative
- All submissions must be submitted electronically in one PDF document.
- Additional items to include with the submission:
 - Photos of the project
 - **Company logos**
- Any departure from the guidelines will be considered incomplete and may result in the judges deeming the entry invalid.
- Entries must be emailed to awards@mattisoncorp.com.
- Submissions must be received no later than Friday, February 27, 2026 at 5 p.m. EST.
