| 2 | 9/2025 | (H) Employee twisted his knee while walking down stairs, resulting in a torn ligament. | | |
| 3 | 9/2025 | (H) While removing pipe above the ceiling grid, employee lost balance and fell approximately 10 feet to the ground, resulting in a punctured lung and broken ribs. | | |
| 4 | 9/2025 | (I) While installing barricade tape, one of the outriggers from a carry deck crane came down and landed on employee's foot. | | |
| 5 | 9/2025 | (I) Improperly stored jack hammer fell onto employee foot and dislocated metatarsals. | | |
| 6 | 9/2025 | (I) Employee tripped while climbing into an air handler and landed on his knee and shoulder and sustained a laceration to the knee. | | |
| 7 | 9/2025 | (I) Employee slipped on dew-covered pipe in the laydown yard, resulting in a hairline ankle fracture. | | |
| 8 | 9/2025 | (I) While crossing a structural I-beam from a scaffold, the employee lost balance when the fall protection retractable locked, causing a knee hyperextension. | | |
| 9 | 9/2025 | (I) Employee lost balance when the fall protection retractable locked while crossing a structural I-beam from a scaffold and fell backward, dislocating their shoulder. | | |
| 10 | 9/2025 | (I) While repositioning a battery grinder in an aerial lift, employee accidentally activated it, causing a laceration to the left arm when it caught on their welding jacket. | | |
| 11 | 9/2025 | (J) Employee cut his finger with a utility knife while opening a box of materials. | | |
| 12 | 9/2025 | (J) Employee's arm came into contact with sharp metal on a rebar road basket and sustained laceration. | | |
| 13 | 9/2025 | (J) While lifting right arm to vacuum a hole, employee sprained ligaments of the spine. | | |
| 14 | 9/2025 | (J) Employee fell and broke his elbow while lifting a concrete parking block. | | |
